It is the goal of the Chaminade Instrumental Music Department to build a highly successful instrumental music program which is rooted in long held traditions, and places well rounded student growth, musical excellence, and student enjoyment as the primary objectives.

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## **Chaminade Instrumental Music Program Mission Statement**

It is the purpose of the Chaminade College Preparatory instrumental music program to teach an application of Music both inside and outside of the school walls. Chaminade is devoted not only to developing the skills of the musicians; but also developing teamwork and family within the Characteristics of a Marianist Education. We wish to inspire students to discover what music can mean to them outside of the classroom. ## **Fine Arts Department Policies**

### **What is the late work policy?**

If an assignment is turned in late, the work will be graded on its merit, with the point deduction capping the maximum grade that can be awarded at a "C" (20%-25% grade deduction range). This means: "A" quality (90%-100% range) late work will earn a "C" grade (70%-79%)

"B" quality (80%-89% range) late work will earn a "D" grade (60%-69%)

"C" or below quality (79% and below) late work will earn an "F" grade (0%-59%) In addition, late work will only be accepted during the unit of study, before the summative assessment. Assignments turned in after the summative assessment is submitted will still receive teacher feedback but they will earn a zero in the grade book.

## **Band Member Expectations**

*Each of the expectations below promote RESPECT and RESPONSIBILITY. Please adhere to them:*

1. BE THERE. All band members are expected to attend all rehearsals and performances. The attendance policy for the Eagle Regiment is detailed below.
2. BE ON TIME. Failure to comply with your assigned call times will result in a consequence deemed appropriate by the director and commensurate with the seriousness of the issue (often loss of participation points).
3. BE PREPARED. Each student is expected to come to band with all necessary materials and equipment each day.
  - a. Pencil...VERY important
  - b. Flip folder/lyre (Required of ALL instrumentalists during Marching Band)
  - c. Dot Book (Spiral Bound Index Cards, 3x5 or 4x6)
  - d. All necessary sheet music
  - e. Brass Instruments: Valve oil, slide grease, soft cloth (Please get your own)
  - f. Woodwind Instruments: Extra reeds, swab, cork grease
  - g. Percussion Instruments: Drum sticks, mallets, practice pad, stick bag
4. BE RESPONSIBLE. Students are expected to properly use, store, and care for instruments, music uniforms, and other materials.
5. BE A GOOD CITIZEN. As with any other class, Chaminade rules apply to us. In addition, a few “band-specific” regulations are listed below:
  - a. Gum, food, and drinks are not permitted in the band room OR on the field (except plain water).
  - b. All instruments and music must be stored correctly after every rehearsal
  - c. Improper use, misuse, or abuse of equipment will not be tolerated
  - d. Follow expectations and guidelines for football games and other performances. These will be discussed separately.
  - e. Consequences for failure to follow rules will include:
    - Verbal warning/on field discipline action
    - After class discussion between student and teacher
    - Detention (Cleaning Duty)
    - Conference with parent
    - Office Referral

## **Attendance Policy**

Because our group can function at full strength only when ALL members are present, ALL members of the Chaminade Bands are expected to attend ALL scheduled events (performances and rehearsals). Please note that student's grade WILL be negatively affected if they receive an unexcused absence or tardy. Any student who has documented a legitimate excused absence in advance will be given the opportunity to make up the performance or rehearsal by completing an extra assignment. Below is the procedure for documenting all absences. All absences must be documented through the correct “ORANGE CARD” process prior to the absence in order to be “excused.”

### **Absence Procedure:**

- Make every effort to avoid absences through pre-planning.
- In the event of a legitimate, unavoidable conflict, complete an “Orange Card” at least two weeks prior to the absence.
  - In the case of serious illness, a form must be completed upon return to school.
- Return the completed, signed form to your director.
- If accepted as an “Excused Absence”, complete a make-up assignment (will be assigned by the director)

- If the assignment is “Unexcused”, you will be unable to recover lost points.
- This procedure is in effect for both performances and rehearsals (if the absence is an in- school rehearsal, please follow proper school procedures).
- An “Unexcused” absence from a Wednesday night rehearsal results in the student not being permitted to march the show on the upcoming game.

\*\*\*While we cannot anticipate all possible conflicts which may arise, the spirit of our attendance expectation is that all students attend all band events unless absolutely impossible. In the event of difficult choices/situations, please communicate with the director well in advance.\*\*\*

Examples of Acceptable Reasons for Absence from Performances/Rehearsals:

- Severe illness
  - Students who are present in school on the day of an event are expected to attend band events that evening.
- Death in the family
- Other family emergency
- Conflicts with other CCP activities...but must be approved in advance by director
- Unavoidable religious obligations (Please contact the director to discuss approval)

Examples of Unacceptable Reasons for Absence from Performances/Rehearsals:

- Work
- Rock concert, non-CCP sporting event, etc.
- Driving class or in-car hours
- “I have Homework”
- “Birthday”
- “Halloween”

Attendance expectation for CCP Athletic/Activity Conflicts:

\*\*\*We value the participation of student-athletes in our band, but stress that these students have made a commitment to each organization.\*\*\*

- Performances/games for one activity take priority over rehearsals/practices of the other.
- When both groups have practice/rehearsal at conflicting times, it is expected that students share time evenly between both groups.
- In the event that both groups have performances/games at the same time, communication
- between directors/coaches/advisors shall determine the course of action.
- Student grades will not be affected by excused sports conflicts as long as the absence procedure is followed.

**Things Eagle Regiment does...**

**Class Time:** Eagle Regiment meets during “D” block. We begin rehearsing ON THE FIELD at 7:50am on Days 2, 4 & 6 of the Chaminade School Schedule (Even Days). Students should arrive in athletic wear, and will be given time to change into their uniform prior to the daily “Nutrition” period. These are during the day and graded.

- TO MAKE-UP D A “D” BLOCK
  - Submit an Audio Recording (via e-mail) of you playing your part
    - Press Record. Say “I’m (your name) making up (day you missed)
    - Play show music/pregame (whatever we’ve been working on)
    - Press stop, SAVE & email the director

**Sectional Rehearsals:** There are essentially 3 sections in the Eagle Regiment.

1. Horn Line - All Wind Instruments, i.e. Flute, trumpet, trombone, saxophone etc.
2. Percussion - Consists of Battery (Percussionists that march and carry their instruments) and the Front Ensemble (Performers that play with the band from a single location on the field and do not march during the halftime show).
3. Guard - Members who add to the visual design of the halftime show through the use of dance and various equipment

Each of these sections will have 1 outside of school rehearsal (in addition to Wednesday Night) to focus on the individual sections music and/or technique.

1. Horn Line - Mondays 3:15 - 5p, Directed by Mr. Delfing
  2. Percussion - TBA, Directed by Mr. Chris Jones
  3. Guard - TBA, Directed by Ms. Tayler Hardie
- TO MAKE-UP A "Sectional Rehearsal"
    - Horn-line: Same as "D" Block
    - Guard/Drumline: See your instructor

**Wednesday Night Rehearsals:** Eagle Regiment also meets every Wednesday Evening ON THE FIELD beginning promptly at 6pm and running until 9pm. If students remain on campus, they are encouraged to use the library and school facilities to do their homework. There are several hours between the end of school and the beginning of rehearsal. These rehearsals are still counted as class rehearsals. they are required and graded.

- The Band room is for rehearsals. The Director reserves the right to remove any students not practicing from the room at any time
- TO MAKE-UP A Wednesday Night Rehearsal
  - Watch the video made of the rehearsal
  - Write a ½-1 page review of what you saw/heard
  - Submit via email to your director BEFORE the next Wednesday Rehearsal

**Home Football Games:** The Eagle Regiment performs at all Home Football games. Students will be in uniform for the entirety of the game, participate in all performance opportunities (Pre-Game, Halftime, During the game, Post Game, cheers, etc.). The students will stand with the band at all times during the game. Students will be temporarily released during the 3rd quarter. At this time they may leave the band area until the scoreboard reads "1:00." Failure to return on time will result in the forfeit of the following games 3rd Quarter break. Home games are graded as a Performance Grade.

- TO MAKE-UP A Home Game
  - Watch the video made of the Performances (Pregame & Halftime)
  - Write a 500-word review of what you saw/heard
  - Submit via email to your director BEFORE the next Wednesday Rehearsal

**Away Football Games:** Eagle Regiment performs at all of the away games. Key differences between home and away games: different uniform and we do not perform on the field. Otherwise the rules stay the same. Away Games are graded as a Performance Grade.

- TO MAKE-UP an AWAY Game
  - Same as "D" Block

**Chaminade Parades:** The Eagle Regiment participated in two (2) parades each year in which we have the opportunity to earn money for the program. The Hidden Hills Parade & the Chatsworth Holiday Parade. These are graded performances, and will be graded as a Performance Grade, just like a Home Football Game.

- TO MAKE-UP A Parade
  - Same as "D" Block

**LACSB Parades\***: The Los Angeles Catholic Schools Band is comprised of many different area Catholic schools, including Chaminade. There are 3 performances and 1 rehearsal that we participate in. While these events are ungraded, students have the opportunity to meet and lead students from smaller schools and make music with new friends. Additionally, it is a chance to be a part of a group much larger than our own band. Student Leaders are expected to participate in all LACSB events. Freshman & Sophomores can receive Service hours for their participation in LACSB events.

**Rallies\***: All Eagle Regiment students are expected to participate in each of the schools Pep Rallies. Students miss no extra class time for these rallies and perform for the student body at the beginning and end of each rally. Students wear their “Away Game Uniform” for these performances.

**Pep Band\***: During Basketball Season, Eagle Regiment performs for all Basketball Home games, Men’s & Women’s. To ease the burden on the students, the Eagle Regiment is divided into 2 smaller bands (Orange & Blue), therefore each group only performs at Half of the games. If a playoff game occurs, students with the best attendance records for their assigned group will be selected to join the playoff pep band.

\* - While these three groupings of Eagle Regiment activities are not graded, they are part of what we as an ensemble do for the school and our community. Service to others is a key element of the Marianist educational system. In each of these performances, we are given the opportunity to use our talents and gifts to serve our classmates around us. These events are not things we do for our own glory and satisfaction, we do these to support and serve our friends and classmates. While choosing to not participate in these events will not affect the students grade, it will affect the students ability to be granted a leadership position in the future, and may affect their eligibility to participate in Eagle Regiment the following year.

## **Grading**

Becoming a proficient musician is a lifelong journey. Therefore we do not grade based on “how good” a student is at music. Since each student is at a different point in musical skill acquirement, students will primarily be graded on their growth as a musician from the point they begin the grading period to the end of the period. Our goal is to develop Independent Musicians Creating Quality Performances.

Band grades will be reported as A, B, C, D, or F, with + or – indicated as necessary. The general policies and procedures of evaluation of Chaminade College Prep shall be followed. The specific objectives and criteria on which the letter grades are based appear below.

Grades will be determined based on the following:

- Class Participation = 50%
- Performance Participation = 50%

### 1. Class Participation

- a. Students earn 10 participation points per rehearsal (including Wednesday evening rehearsals). Points are inputted roughly every 2 weeks. If a student is not in a rehearsal, they cannot earn participation points. An unexcused absence results in a 0/10. An excused absence results in a 0/0.

### 2. Performance Participation

- a. There are an estimated 16-20 performances during the semester (depending on the number of playoff games for football).
- b. Each performance will be worth 40 points, graded as follows:
  - Performance = 10
  - Stands Etiquette/behavior = 10
  - Proper Uniform = 10
  - Promptness = 10.

## **Performance Expectations**

### **Football Games:**

1. At the scheduled reporting time, students will go through a uniform inspection (detailed later in the Handbook).
2. The Eagle Regiment uniform must always be worn properly and entirely unless otherwise directed by the director.
3. Play your instrument only as part of the group while in the stands or on the field.
4. Please ask your guests to sit outside of the band section and thank them for watching and supporting us.
5. Follow directions the first time.
6. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter is your chance to get refreshments and use the restroom. Group A will leave immediately and MUST be back in the stands ready to perform when the game clock reads 7:00 remaining. Group B will leave upon Group A's return and will be back in the stands ready to perform with no less than 1:00 remaining in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter so that we can play between the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Quarters. Remember: Uniforms stay on during this break!
7. Visiting alumni may not be in the stands with students and must remain either with the directors or in the general admission stands.
8. EYES WITH PRIDE! Have pride in yourselves, and also in the football team that represents our school. You are REQUIRED to cheer with the Cheerleaders during the game. They are doing the same job as you, supporting and cheering for our fellow classmates on the field.

### **Band Bus Expectations:**

1. All students are expected to ride school transportation both to and from all outside performances.
2. If you need alternative transportation from a performance, please fill out the Transportation Release Form (Yellow Card) available outside the band office.
  - a. This card should be turned in no later than the Wednesday Night Rehearsal prior to the event in question.
3. Please follow all directions given by the Director and **Leadership** in regards to how to wear the uniform.
4. Please do not have drinks on the bus (except water).
5. Use common sense and follow directions. Riding a bus is easy.

## **Marching Band Uniforms**

Marching band students will be issued a uniform for the school year and are responsible for the storage and maintenance of all uniform parts. It is the student's responsibility to have the uniform professionally dry cleaned and left in the cleaning bag for Uniform Check-in (Late Spring Semester). Students will be charged a replacement fee for ANY missing uniform parts upon check-in. Wind and Percussion will need to purchase a pair of Black Marching Shoes and Black socks.

Wind and Percussion students will receive: (Replacement costs in Parentheses)

Uniform Jacket (\$250)/Collar (\$10)

Uniform Pants (\$125)

Shako (\$50)/Plume (\$20)/Hat Box (\$35)

Uniform Bag (\$25)

Color Guard students will have varying show uniforms on a year-to-year basis, but a consistent school uniform.

Black and Nude Split-Sole Jazz Shoes, Black Leotard, Navy Pre-game Costume-Borrowed from the music program (\$150)

### Away Game Attire

Show T-Shirt, Blue Denim Jeans, Tennis Shoes and Band Jacket (optional).

### Fees/Accessories

This year, each student participating in Marching Band will be charged a \$1,150.00 fee. A payment plan is listed below. That fee includes the following: (individual cost)

- 2 Work T-shirts (\$12 each) that the students will wear underneath the marching band uniform
- 1 Show T-Shirt (\$20) for away games and at competitions.
- 1 End-of-year Banquet ticket (\$45)
- White gloves (\$6)
- Band Camp (\$675)
- Championships (\$330)
- Program Fee (\$50)

The following items families will need to purchase on their own:

The following items are OPTIONAL and can be purchased through the band

- A Band **Polo shirt** (\$15) that is school uniform approved (They can wear it to school).
- Band Jacket (~\$70)

Parents may order a polo shirt and/or a Show shirt for themselves as well.

### Wearing the Uniform:

- All students must wear the Work Shirt underneath the uniform.
- Trousers should be adjusted by turning under the necessary amount of material and then sewing it in place. **Never remove any cloth from the uniform.** Adjust the length of the trouser legs so that they are three (3) inches from the floor at the heel of the shoe.
- Jewelry shall be worn at a minimum while in uniform. A watch and ring may be worn if desired. All students with pierced ears should remove their earrings or wear studs. No visible jewelry may be in colors outside of School colors (gold/silver are acceptable).
- Sunglasses are only worn at the discretion of the director.
- Fingernail polish should only be in neutral or school colors

## **Marching Band Uniform Inspection**

Prior to all marching band performances, students will be subject to a uniform inspection. The inspection will occur at the reporting time on the band schedule. At this time, students will meet in parade block, in full uniform, and be called to attention. Band staff will inspect the student's uniform, making sure that all pieces are being worn correctly and that students are not breaking the uniform dress code. (This includes cleanliness of the uniform) If a student's uniform is found unacceptable for performance and it is not possible to remedy the infraction prior to performance, the student will not be permitted to perform on the marching band field with the band and their performance grade will be lowered. If a student does not pass inspection, students will be permitted to march in with the band to the stadium, perform in the stands during the game, participate in all other band related activities during the game. The alternative assignment for the student to maintain partial credit for their performance grade will be to stand at attention on the sidelines between the 35 and 30 yard lines, towards the north end of the field, facing the band during the field performance. The students will rejoin the band as they march off the field and continue to participate in the remaining band activities for the performance. It is the personal responsibility of each member of the band to maintain the uniform assigned to them for the entirety of the season.

### **Damaged or Soiled Uniform:**

If a uniform is found to be damaged due to normal wear or soiled by an accident with food or drink, please inform a staff member to seek repair, replacement, or professional cleaning of the uniform part prior to that week's performance. DO NOT expect your uniform to be repaired or cleaned on the day of a performance, plan ahead and give us the week to help you be ready for inspection.

### **Lost items:**

If you have lost or damaged (beyond repair) one of the uniform pieces you purchased through the parent council, parents will have these items available for purchase prior to performances. You will not be able to "loan" uniform pieces. Replacement pieces are on a first come/first serve basis, if you know of a need of a new item, it would be a good idea to let staff know ahead of time to order a new part so it is available for the performance. Don't forget, being out of full uniform will result in not passing inspection.

## **Physical Conditioning in Marching Band**

Marching Band is without a doubt a very physically demanding and strenuous activity. As such, a significant amount of time and energy will be devoted to increasing the physical fitness and stamina of marching band members. This will include such activities as running/jogging, jumping jacks, marching drills, and other calisthenics. In order to prepare yourself for these demands, we HIGHLY RECOMMEND the following:

- Exercise: Begin prior to the start of marching band season.
- Hydration: Drink water the night before and regularly throughout the activity.
- Diet: Be sure to eat a good breakfast each morning. Good food choices are a plus, also!
- Clothing: Choose clothing, footwear, and hats that are appropriate for the activity.
- Sunscreen

In addition, students sustaining injuries or illness during rehearsals or performances, which require them to stop the activity, will receive basic treatment and rest up to an hour. If at that time they are not in a condition to return to band, a parent will be contacted and an individual plan for that student will be developed.

## **Instrument Checkout and Storage Policy**

### **Instrument Checkout:**

- Students and parents who are renting a school owned instrument will be required to read and sign a rental agreement form.



## **Instrument Storage:**

- Students may store their instrument in the storage lockers in the band room during the school day. Students should also NEVER store their instrument in their car; this will cause severe damage to the instrument affecting the quality.
- Although the band room is secure, others have access and there is always the chance that something could occur. Chaminade does NOT take responsibility for instruments and equipment that are left overnight.
  - They are LOCKERS, so bring a Lock! (The director must have the combination/spare key)
- If the band room is not open when students arrive they must take their instrument with them. They are not allowed to leave it outside of the band room door for security reasons. They also may not leave it in Campus Ministry or other locations on campus. They may check back later in the day to see if they can put it in the band room, otherwise they should carry it throughout the day.
- Instruments that are left overnight are not being practiced, and practice is the main homework assignment within a performance ensemble.

## **Student Leadership**

The Leadership students are responsible for representing the band and providing input when certain decisions concerning the group are made. This group is also responsible for assisting with numerous tasks that arise over the course of the year. For a detailed list of the specific duties assigned to each of the individual officers, please see the Student Leadership section of the website.

## **ACT/SAT**

ACT and SAT exams are not excused absences from a performance. Please be sure to reference the online calendar and the director when scheduling these exams. During the fall, Eagle Regiment members may be excused after the third quarter for an ACT/SAT exam on the following day with prior permission from the director.

Do NOT choose the following dates:

- September 14 (ACT) - Eagle Regiment Hidden Hills Parade
- November 2nd (SAT) – Eagle Regiment Riverside Community College Competition

Available but not Recommended:

- August 24th (SAT) - LACSB Grand Marian Parade
- December 14th (ACT) - Band & Choir Concert the night before

Any other test dates should work fine with the Eagle Regiment Schedule.

## **Retreats**

Students are highly encouraged to participate in the school's retreat program, but need to be cautious when scheduling which retreat they will be attending. Please do NOT schedule a retreat that conflicts with a Major performance.

Do NOT schedule one of the following retreats:

- Lumos #1: Sept. 11-13 (Rehearsal, Home Game, Middle School Night, Hidden Hills on Sat.)
- Kairos #1: Sept. 17-20 (Rehearsal, Away Game)
- Lumos #2: Oct. 9-11 (Rehearsal, Away Game, Ayala on Sat.)
- Emmaus #1: Oct. 22-24 (Rehearsal, Away Game)

- **Kairos #2: Nov. 5-8 (Rehearsal, Possible Playoff Game, Trabuco on Sat.)**

Every other available retreat works with the current Eagle Regiment Schedule. Feel free to book any of the other retreats, and let your director know which retreat you have chosen (especially if it is during Marching Band Season).

## **Travel/Trip Policy**

### **Travel:**

- In order to travel with any of the Chaminade Music Program Ensembles each student **MUST** have a medical release form on file with the Director. Be sure to include any medication or special circumstances that the staff should be aware of in case of an emergency.
- Students are expected to follow all school rules (including smoking, drinking, drugs, and weapons) while traveling and are subject to the same disciplinary consequences upon return. In some cases the student may be asked to be picked up or sent home on the parent's expense.
- Travel with the Chaminade Music Programs is a privilege, not a given, and can be revoked at the director's discretion. Students may be removed from non-graded trips due to low academic grades.
- Students who are on the school ineligibility list will **NOT** be allowed to travel or participate in extra events.

### **Trips:**

- Trip frequency and destination will be determined on a year-to-year basis by the director.
- All of the School/Travel Policies are in effect in a trip situation, with the added responsibility of overnight stay. A mandatory meeting will be held with ALL traveling students and parents before the trip to cover the specific rules and details.
- A payment schedule will be used on years when a trip occurs.
- Due to the monetary demands travel is not mandatory, but it is **HIGHLY** encouraged in order to maintain the musical integrity of the performance ensemble. If the proper instrumentation is not able to be achieved a trip can/will be cancelled. If there are monetary concerns please speak with the director on an individual basis.

## **Posting Online Information**

Students and parents are not allowed to post anything online using the Chaminade name. Any posting concerning Chaminade or the Band Program must come from Chaminade administration. Any postings in violation will be flagged and removed. Please use discretion in any online groups or blogs and air on the side of caution.

## **Other groups closely related to Eagle Regiment**

### **Winter Drumline:**

The Drumline is an extracurricular/competitive continuation of the fall Eagle Regiment percussion section that expands upon the experience of the field to include greater visual demands and is open to anyone interested in becoming a member. This group will meet two or more times per week to prepare for their performance and competition season. Drumline is similar to a "club" sport, in that it is competitive, there is a cost (usually between \$400 & \$500), and it is not a class taken for credit.

### **Winter Guard:**

The Winter Guard is an extracurricular/competitive continuation of the fall Eagle Regiment Color Guard section that expands upon the experience of the field to include greater visual demands and is open to

anyone interested in becoming a member. This group will meet two or more times per week to prepare for their performance and competition season. Guard is similar to a “club” sport, in that it is competitive, there is a cost (usually between \$200 & \$300), and it is not a class taken for credit.

### **Chaminade Alma Mater and Fight Song**
